

Hon. Secretary's Report for 1953

Looking back on 1953, I can truthfully echo a phrase of one of my colleagues and say "We have achieved something". We have been represented at exhibitions in Leeds, London, Liverpool and Manchester, and shall have our own stand at the York Miniature Railway Society's Exhibition again this year (St. William's College, 30-31/12/53 and 1-2/1/54). It is hoped to commence work on the Society's own layout on a new baseboard early in the new year, in time for a proposed N.G.R.S. Exhibition in Leeds during Whit-week.

The elusive plates from the former Welsh Highland Rly. Locomotives are now on permanent display in the Queen Street section of the York Railway Museum and thanks are due to all members who contributed to the cost of mounting them.

"Isabel", the 2'0" gauge saddle tank locomotive preserved by W.G.Bagnall Ltd., after initial efforts by one or two Society members, is now mounted on a stand at the Castle Engineering Works, Stafford. Photographs will be ready shortly.

Membership has risen considerably, mainly due to press announcements, and the raising of the subscription to 3/- has enabled us to proceed with the idea of making "Narrow Gauge" more like a magazine. Commencing with this issue, it will appear in this size quarterly. There was not enough news to warrant the expense of issuing an edition in November, and I would like to ask all members to send in items of news if they possibly can.

I think this is the ideal time to release the news that two locomotive nameplates from the former Leek and Manifold Railway [have been found] in a Leeds scrap yard, and I hope to print the full story in the next issue; sufficient to say that, in order to ensure their preservation, one or two Leeds members have contributed to the cost of acquiring them at their scrap value (£4.-.-.).

News is given elsewhere in this issue of the presentation to the Society of an 0-4-0 saddle tank loco, which we hope to take possession of shortly.

Well, that's a brief outline of the past year's events. May I say "Thank You" to <u>all</u> members who have helped in one way or another to further our interests.

<u>VALE OF RHEIDOL RAILWAY</u>. Following rumours that it is intended to close the Vale of Rheidol Railway, members may be interested in the following letter received from the Western Region of British Railways:-

"The train service over the Vale of Rheidol Branch, between Aberystwyth and Devil's Bridge, has been operating for the summer months only for some considerable time and no decision has yet been reached in respect of the service over the branch next summer.

The continued operation of this branch, like others, is, for economic reasons, continually under consideration, and I shall be pleased to communicate with you again if and when a decision in regard to the permanent closing of the branch is taken."
